

The Onondaga County Medical Examiner's Office, a NAME-accredited office in Syracuse, New York, is the regional medical examiner's office for Central New York. The office is located in the Center for Forensic Sciences, a fully integrated state-of-the-art forensic facility that also houses the county's forensic laboratories.

Our office has funding for a chief medical examiner and 3 forensic pathologist/medical examiner positions. The successful candidate will join a dedicated staff including: a director of operations, 9 forensic investigators with ABMDI credentials, 5 assistant forensic investigators, 5 autopsy technicians, 2 morgue attendants, and other administrative personnel.

The office has an in-house ABFT-accredited toxicology lab and access to forensic anthropology, forensic odontology services as well as clinical, pathology, and neuropathology specialties through the State University of New York (SUNY) Upstate Medical University.

JOB DUTIES

Responsibilities includes investigating deaths, performing autopsies, and court testimony as requested. The position may include an academic appointment with SUNY Upstate Medical University, Department of Pathology for the training of pathology residents in autopsy and forensic pathology.

QUALIFICATIONS

MD or DO degree with American Board of Pathology certification in anatomic pathology and board eligibility in forensic pathology. Current or ability to obtain a license to practice medicine in the State of New York.
