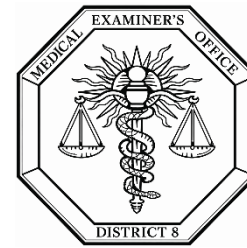

The Florida District 8 Office of the Medical Examiner is seeking a full-time Associate Medical Examiner to join our forensic pathology practice in Gainesville, Florida.

District 8 serves Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Dixie, Gilchrist, Levy, and Union Counties, providing medicolegal death investigation services throughout North Central Florida. We offer an opportunity to practice high-quality forensic pathology with substantial professional independence, a sustainable caseload, experienced investigative and technical support, and an exceptional degree of schedule flexibility.

THE PRACTICE

The District 8 Office of the Medical Examiner performs approximately 450–500 autopsies annually across its seven-county jurisdiction. The expected individual physician workload is approximately 200–225 autopsies per year, allowing time for careful case evaluation, timely reporting, consultation, continuing education, and a sustainable professional life.

The Associate Medical Examiner will practice with substantial professional independence within Florida's statutory medicolegal framework. Physicians determine the appropriate extent of postmortem examination, evaluate investigative and medical information, interpret ancillary studies, certify cause and manner of death, and provide expert testimony when required.

Scene attendance is at the medical examiner's discretion. On-call responsibilities are shared equitably among the medical examiners, and autopsies are not routinely performed on weekends or holidays.

When the physician is not performing postmortem examinations or otherwise required to be physically present, remote work is available, allowing reports, records review, case consultation, and other professional responsibilities to be completed away from the office.

EXCEPTIONAL SUPPORT

Physicians are supported by an experienced multidisciplinary team that includes:

- Three medicolegal death investigators providing 24/7 investigative coverage
- Four autopsy technicians
- A Director of Operations and dedicated administrative staff
- Comprehensive ancillary testing and specialty consultation as needed

- Be legally authorized to work in the United States; visa sponsorship is not available

Current forensic pathology fellows, including fellows completing training in 2027, are encouraged to apply. The anticipated start date is flexible and can be coordinated with the selected candidate.
