This is specialized medical work in the determination of the cause and manner of deaths coming under the jurisdiction of the Medical Examiner. Work includes determining the existence of criminal acts or negligence on the part of the person or persons responsible, and also involves assuming responsibility for activities of the medical examiner's office in the evening and on assigned weekend shifts. This role is distinguished from lower-level pathologists by the employee's demonstrated mastery of forensic pathology. Contact with families and a variety of governmental agencies, hospitals, physicians, and others in the conduct of individual cases is a significant aspect of the work.
