This position works with one other forensic pathologist and support staff to direct and perform approximately 400 autopsies per year in accordance with NAME autopsy performance standards.

The ME's Office opened in 2019. The facility provides two autopsy stations in the operator where the northern exposure provides enhanced lighting for fine procedures, a 29-decedent body cooler allows the office to meet service demands for the County and our partners including neighboring counties, the US Parks Service, the US Forest Service and the Federal Bureau of Investigation .

- CERTIFICATION IN FORENSIC PATHOLOGY BY THE ABP. IF ELIGIBLE AT THE TIME OF APPOINTMENT, FP CERTIFICATION TO BE COMPLETED WITHIN TWO YEARS OF HIRE.
