DEPUTY MEDICAL EXAMINER

The Macomb County Medical Examiner's Office is charged with investigating deaths due to violence, accidents and those not attended by a physician. Under the direction of the medical examiner, the deputy will perform post-mortem examinations, including microscopic and toxicology studies. They will also respond to scene investigations of homicides and suspicious deaths, testify as an expert witness and prepare reports, among other responsibilities.

Requirements:

- Graduate of a regularly chartered and legally constituted medical school or college, or osteopathic medical school or college
- Completed a training program in anatomic pathology accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education or equivalent
- One year experience in the medical examiner and/or forensic field
- Physician license and in good standing in the State of Michigan
- Board certified in anatomic and forensic pathology by the American Board of Pathology or by the American Osteopathic Board of Pathology
