Job Description: The [Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine](#) at the [Robert Larner, M.D. College of Medicine](#) and the [University of Vermont Health Network \(UVMHN\)](#) is seeking a dedicated academic Gastrointestinal (GI) and Liver Pathologist for a full-time faculty appointment. The [Division of Anatomic Pathology](#) is composed of subspecialty services with most faculty providing diagnostic patient care in two subspecialty areas. The candidate will join our other GI and Liver Pathology Service consisting of five pathologists and be responsible for diagnostic sign-out, multidisciplinary conferences, collaborative research, and education. Additional subspecialty interest in other areas of anatomic pathology will be supported, allowing candidates to practice based on interests and/or prior training and experience.

The University of Vermont Health Network is composed of seven hospitals, including the academic [University of Vermont Medical Center](#) (UVMHC) in [Burlington, Vermont](#), six community hospitals spanning the “north country” of New York and the central Vermont regions, [and Home Health and Hospice](#). Our Anatomic Pathology Division is staffed by 30 FTE pathologists to review approximately 45,000 surgical pathology specimens annually.

Burlington is situated on [Lake Champlain](#) in the Champlain Valley and surrounded by the beautiful [Green Mountains](#) in Vermont and the [Adirondack Mountains](#) in north country New York. Few locations rival the quality of life possible in this picturesque setting, and working with the pathologists and staff at UVMHC provides a supportive work environment. Ample small-town communities exist for a quiet, peaceful living experience, and for those seeking convenient access to amenities, Burlington offers a vibrant living experience associated with college and university towns.

- Become a colleague in our department composed of 66 anatomic pathology, clinical pathology, and research faculty colleagues.
- Join our current GI and Liver Pathology Service and receive mentorship from a nationally recognized, experienced pathologist.
- Provide diagnostic pathology for the patients we serve in Vermont, upstate New York, and New Hampshire, resulting in a total of 45,000 surgical pathology specimens annually.
- Engage in the education and mentoring of medical students, [16 residents](#), and fellows in general surgical pathology, dermatopathology, cytopathology, and hematopathology.
- Pursue scholarly activities and participation in [clinical](#) and/or [basic science research](#).

Qualifications:

- Board eligibility or certification in Anatomic Pathology.

- GI and Liver Pathology Fellowship training and/or demonstrated 5+ years of experience in GI and Liver Pathology.
- Commitment to educational, scholarly, and clinical excellence.
