Summary

This is a full-time, TEMPORARY – 1 YEAR paid Forensic Pathology Physician Fellowship. Benefits are provided to the Fellow in accordance with established Office of the Medical Examiner policy for full time non-bargaining unit employees. These benefits currently include:

- Health, dental and vision insurance (at then current employee contribution rates)
- Life Insurance
- PERS Pension Program
- Deferred Compensation
- Sick Leave (which includes Maternity/Paternity leave)
- Workers' Compensation

The Fellow shall receive two (2) weeks annual vacation.

Details regarding eligibility and coverage for these and other benefit items are contained in the Employee Handbook and the Fellowship Program Statement which will be provided upon hire.

Minimum Requirements

1. Have a Doctor of Medicine (MD) or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO) degree
2. Have successfully completed an ACGME-accredited Anatomic Pathology residency
3. Able to secure a State of Ohio medical license

Responsibilities

Fellowship Physicians are expected to undertake the following responsibilities:

- Develop a personal program of self-study and professional growth with guidance from the teaching staff
- Participate in safe, effective, and compassionate death investigation under supervision, commensurate with their level of advancement and responsibility

- Participate fully in the educational activities of the program and as required, assume
- responsibility for teaching and supervising other fellows, residents and students
- Participate in institutional programs and activities involving the medical staff.
- Participate in institutional committees and councils, especially those that relate to death investigation review activities
- Apply cost containment measures while providing quality death investigation

The Fellow agrees to cooperate with the Office of the Medical Examiner in acquiring appropriate licensure to practice medicine in the State of Ohio, in accordance with legal

The Forensic Pathology Fellow shall not have a paid position elsewhere ("moonlighting") while serving this fellowship.

The Fellow agrees to abide by the practices, procedures, rules, and policies of The Cuyahoga County Office of the Medical Examiner including but not limited to:

- a) The Office of the Medical Examiner has a right to perform drug testing during pre-employment screening and thereafter upon reasonable suspicion of use to detect the presence of alcohol and/or drugs of abuse in anticipation of the Office of the Medical Examiner policy on promoting a drug-free workplace; and
- b) The Office of the Medical Examiner policies, practices, and procedures on preventing the transmission of blood-borne pathogens and other state, local and federal regulations; and
