

The Brown County Medical Examiner's Office is currently seeking a full-time Deputy Medical Examiner/Forensic Pathologist to join our team in Green Bay, Wisconsin. Our Office serves Brown County and the neighboring Counties of Door and Oconto, with a population total of approximately 340,000.



Minimum Qualifications

Graduation from an accredited school of medicine. Candidates must be eligible for medical licensure in the State of Wisconsin and must be board-eligible or certified in Forensic Pathology.



Expectations

Performs primary functions of a forensic pathologist in accordance with NAME standards to determine cause and manner of death in Medical Examiner cases. Maintain report turnaround times that meet or exceed NAME-Accreditation Standards.



Benefits

The benefits offered for medical, dental, and vision are all extremely competitive. Medical insurance through UMR (UHC Choice Plus Network) offers coverage at all major health systems in the area. The voluntary Personal Health Assessment program allows employees the potential for reduced health premiums. The Brown County Employee Health & Wellness Center was recently established, with no cost for primary care visits, preventative care visits, or lab tests. Telehealth options are available at no cost to employees.

The WRS (Wisconsin Retirement System) is among the most wellfunded and well-managed public pension systems in the country. Other benefits include Life Insurance, Disability Insurance, and Flexible Spending Accounts.
