Job Summary/Essential Job Functions

The associate medical examiner will perform functions of a forensic pathologist, conducting post-mortem examinations, and associated work duties.

Requirements

At minimum, applicants must have an MD or DO degree, certification by the American Board of Pathology in Anatomic Pathology and Forensic Pathology, and eligibility for medical licensure in Florida. If the applicant is not Board certified at the time of hiring, certification in both Anatomic and Forensic Pathology should be completed within two years.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Performs primary functions of a forensic pathologist in accordance with industry standards to determine manner and cause of death in accordance to Florida Statute 406.11.
- Maintains all required licenses and accreditations consistent with the industry standards.
- Maintains individual continuing medical education and assures compliance with licensing and certification requirements.
- Assists in the training of forensic pathology fellow, participate in teaching the University of South Florida pathology residents.
- Provides expert testimony in criminal and civil court as requested.

Benefits

Hillsborough County participates in the Florida Retirement System, and provides an excellent benefit package including:

About Hillsborough County Medical Examiner

- In 2024, our pathologists performed 1,283 autopsies, 788 external examinations, and 7,173 case reviews.
- The Hillsborough County Medical Examiner facility was built in 2008 and includes 3 separate administration, morgue, and toxicology buildings.
- The facility is home to 2 board-certified forensic toxicologists, a board-certified neuropathologist, 13 ABMDI-certified medicolegal death investigators, 13 autopsy technicians, 2 experienced transcriptionists, a cold case unit that utilizes forensic investigative genetic genealogy, and a contracted, board certified, forensic anthropologist.
- The 10-acre campus can support a mass fatality contingency while maintaining daily operations. A designated area provides room for refrigerated trailers that can accommodate an additional 200 bodies.
- The facility can sustain on-site operations following a hurricane. It was built on high ground with two days worth of back-up power.
