Who We Are

Recognized as national leaders in our respective fields, the scientific staff members of the Kentucky Office of the Medical Examiner assist Kentucky coroners and law enforcement agencies in all aspects of death investigation. The office is in the pristine Central Laboratory Facility that houses the Kentucky State Police Crime Laboratory and the Department of Public Health Laboratory. The office is supported by the NAME-accredited Office of the Chief Medical Examiner who fosters an engaging, positive workplace culture, is committed to excellence, and believes in mutual respect, kindness, and trust. Approximately 1,100 examinations, including external examinations, are conducted yearly in a well-equipped space that features LODOX imaging technology with odontology, neuropathology, and anthropology services available. Attendance at scenes is exceedingly rare, and examinations, weekends, and holiday coverage are shared equitably among the staff.

Responsibilities

Join two full-time, in-house forensic pathologists. Autopsy coverage is also supported by multiple FPs at the nearby Office of the State Medical Examiner, Louisville to ensure caseloads remain below the accreditation standards.

Job Requirements

This executive branch/unclassified state position requires board certification or eligibility by the American Board of Pathology in Anatomic and Forensic Pathology, and licensure to practice medicine in the state of Kentucky at the time of employment.
