### Job Summary/Essential Job Functions

The deputy medical examiner will perform functions of a forensic pathologist, conducting post-mortem examinations, and associated work duties.

### Requirements

At minimum, applicants must have an MD or DO degree, certification/eligibility by the American Board of Pathology in Anatomic Pathology and Forensic Pathology, and eligibility for medical license in Texas.

### Duties and Responsibilities

- Performs primary functions of a forensic pathologist in accordance with NAME standards to determine manner and cause of death in medical examiner cases
- Maintains all required licenses and accreditations consistent with the industry standards
- Maintains individual continuing medical education and assures compliance with licensing and certification requirements
- Assists in the training of forensic pathology fellow
- Provides expert testimony in criminal and civil court as requested
