Academic Autopsy Pathology

The Department of Pathology at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) is pleased to announce a new recruitment for an academic autopsy pathologists due to a retirement and expansion of our autopsy case load at the UAB Regional Autopsy Center. We are inviting applications from qualified candidates at all ranks for a full-time, tenure earning/tenured position through the Department of Pathology, School of Medicine. The candidates should have an M.D. or D.O. or M.D. Ph.D., Board Certification in Anatomic Pathology, and be eligible for a license to practice medicine in Alabama. The successful candidate beyond starting Assistant Professors should have a national reputation in academic pathology and/or a track record of a competitive basic, translational, and/or clinically focused research program. Subspecialty expertise in **Autopsy/Forensic Pathology, Perinatal or Pediatric Pathology, Cardiovascular Pathology and/or Undergraduate Medical Education** will be favorably considered.

The University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) Regional Autopsy Center is an outstanding tertiary care autopsy referral center currently processing nearly 400 autopsies per year including up to 200 medical autopsies from UAB and nearly 200 autopsies from outside UAB. Outside cases include clients throughout Alabama including the Alabama Department of Forensic Science, the Alabama Department of Corrections, the Alabama Department of Public Health and numerous community hospitals and pathology groups as well as select private autopsies. The autopsy pathology service in the Division of Anatomic Pathology includes 3 full time faculty members and 1 part time faculty member with expertise encompassing forensic pathology, cardiovascular pathology and perinatal pathology. Faculty members are noted for multidisciplinary academic productivity, national leadership and both national and international research collaborations. The autopsy faculty enthusiastically participate in fellow, resident and medical student education.

A pre-employment background investigation is performed on candidates selected for employment. In addition, physicians and other clinical faculty candidates who will be employed by the University of Alabama Health Services Foundation (UAHSF) or other UAB Medicine entities must successfully complete a pre-employment drug screen to be hired.
