What is SUDEP?

SUDDEN UNEXPECTED DEATH IN EPILEPSY

SUDEP refers to a death in a person with epilepsy that is not caused by injury, drowning, or other known causes.

- It is the most common epilepsy related cause of death.
- Research estimates that 1 in 1,000 people with epilepsy will die suddenly each year from SUDEP. SUDEP is even more common in those with uncontrolled convulsive seizures.
- SUDEP most often happens during nocturnal hours, and the person is typically found on or near their bed.
- Improved reporting of SUDEP on death certificates is needed for more accurate tracking.

 Avoid assumptions and consider SUDEP as a possible cause in a person with a history of seizures.
